As a drum major, he's got what it takes.

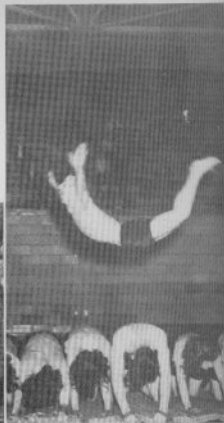
