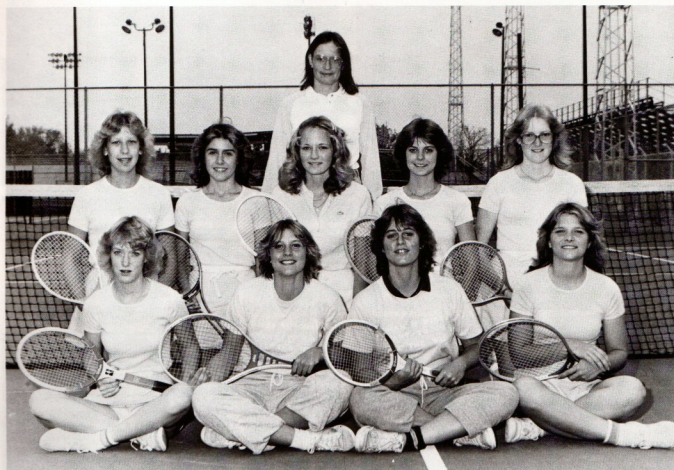
Cathy drives on!

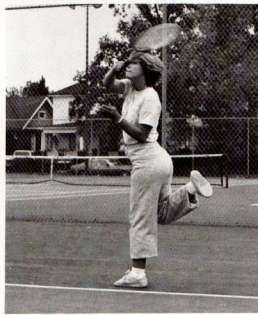

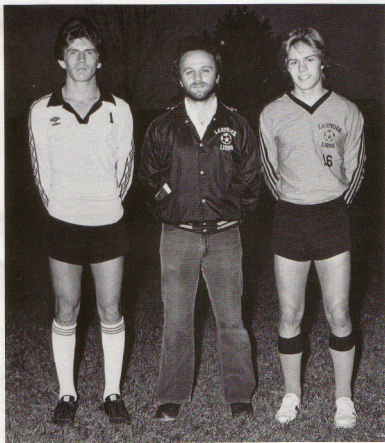

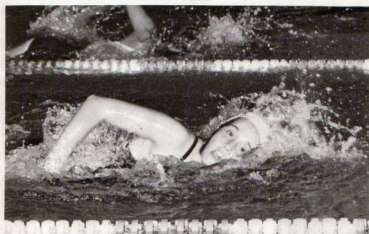
Girls' Swimming

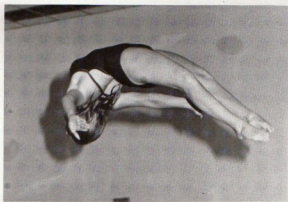

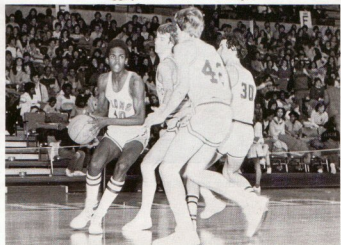

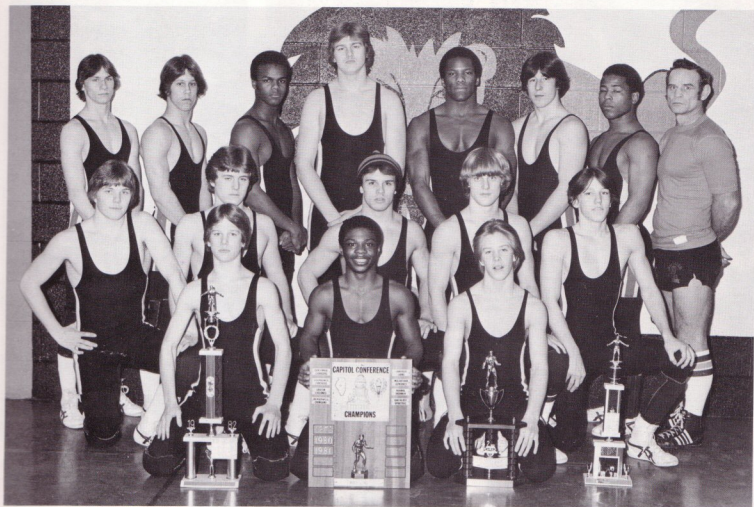
Junior Varsity Girls' Basketball

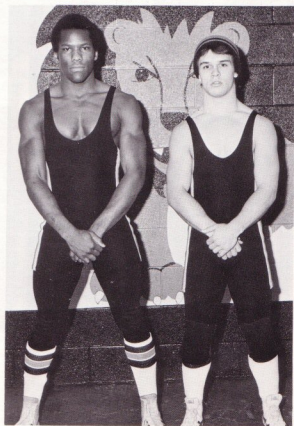

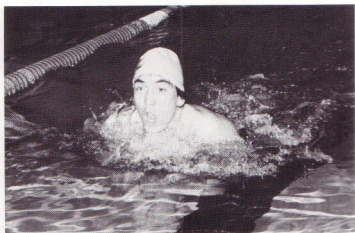

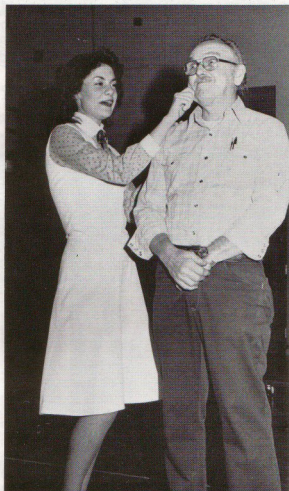

Lions' Pride performs at the Christmas Concert.

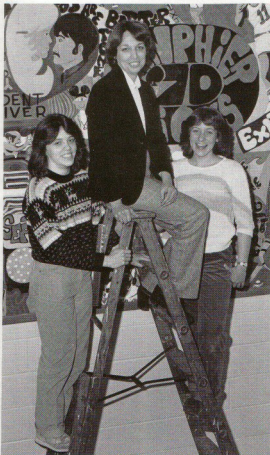

Pride attended a workshop at Western Illinois University. They were given some instruction in improving and perfecting their choreography by Western's swing choir.

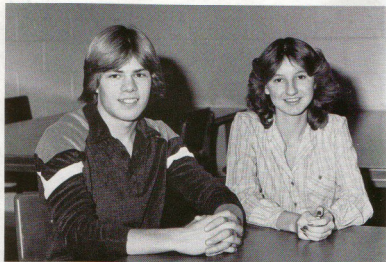
