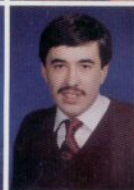
In Denmark they have no sports directly related to school. Outside activities consist of tennis, and EVERYONE plays soccer!

Helene's stay ended in January. Her future plans upon returning to Denmark included attending college at Copenhagen to study biology.

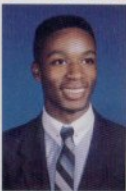
