The responses received were varied, but all denoted some special privilege for seniors only.

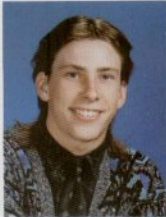
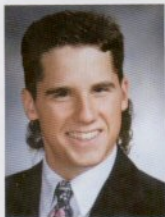

Other popular responses were that seniors should have a closer parking lot, a special hall for seniors lockers only, the right to ridicule underclassmen, the abili-

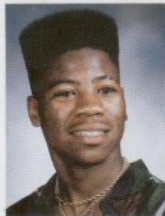
ty to choose teachers, a senior lounge, a separate lunchroom line, a free hour of the day, more college days, and free admission to all sporting events.

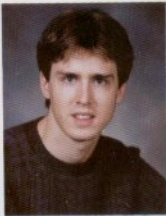
SLEEP. That's another one of those words that becomes more and more unfamiliar as the year progresses. Perhaps the most
