iors were quick with their responses . . .

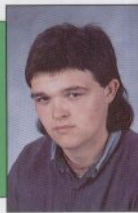

Die Hard!!!

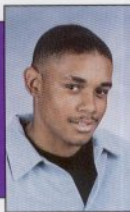

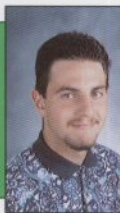
200 word essays never seemed to portray you just right. Those scholarship applications and financial aid forms were another source of excruciating fun.

Is There A Cure?

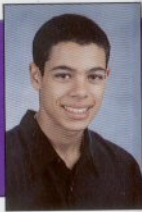

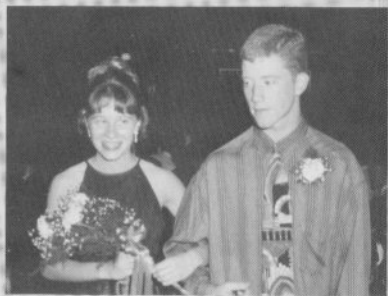
