I am considered a class clown with a funny personality. I don't really care about my image or what other people think of me. I love football and wrestling.

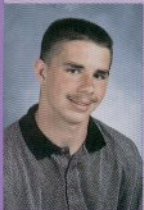

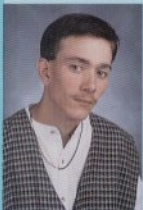


## Senior

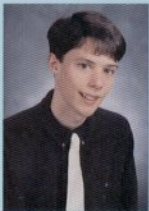

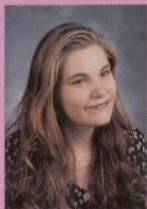

"no walking, no talking, no passing of anything." Remember the mole songs? . . . "A mole is a unit or have you heard: containing six times ten to the twenty third."

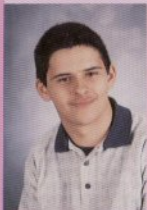

So what strange or weird habit did you possess? Trish Papin simply stated, "I am a weird habit."

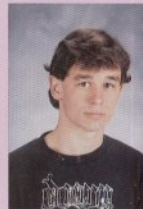

Everyone had some kind of weird habit whether they realized it or not. So are you tired of your friends chuckling at you? Be aware of what you are doing!

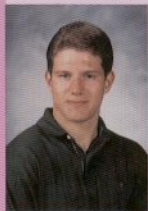
