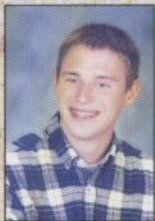
School was over and seniors looked back on their high school careers and what they had accomplished. They also looked ahead to unknown futures as the world was in front of them: Success or failure — time would tell.

The Homecoming Parade kicked off at 11:30 a.m. on October 11. Organizations that entered in the float contest

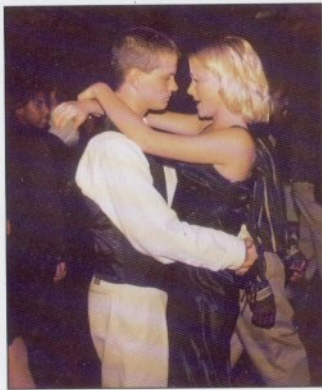
were: Chemistry Club, JETS, Art Club, SGA, cheerleaders, pomps, sophomore and senior class officers. The SGA float won first place.

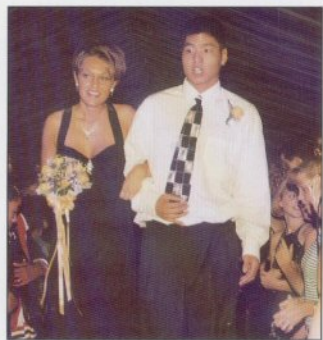
